

Help Keep our Residents Safe from COVID-19

A message from: The Village at Skyline Pines

Dear Residents, Families, Friends,

We are committed to keeping our residents safe and we need your help. We are restricting all visitation. All visitation is being restricted except for certain compassionate care situations, such as end of life situations. These visitors will first be screened for fever and respiratory symptoms. Family and friends, we are taking this aggressive action to keep your loved one safe. To protect our vulnerable residents, many have asked what our protocol is at the facility for the staff who come and go that take care of your loved ones. All employees reporting to work are screened for symptoms. Additionally, we are assessing residents daily for fevers and symptoms of respiratory infection in order to quickly identify ill residents and implement additional infection prevention activities. All residents are safe and healthy and doing well and they are all demonstrating the proper infection control. All team members of The Village at Skyline Pines are trained in Infection control and understand the importance of keeping the residents safe and healthy.

We know that your presence is important for your loved one but, per guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), and the South Dakota Health Department this is a necessary action to protect their health. We are introducing alternative methods of visitation (such as Skype and FaceTime, calling the residents phone or writing a letter) so that you can continue to communicate with your loved ones.

We encourage the families who would like to skype or facetime please contact Heather at HeatherB@TheVillageRC.com to set up and arrange a time.

In addition, anyone who is dropping off supplies for residents please drop it off with their name on it at the front. Between the two front entrance doors between the hours of 9-4 Monday- Sunday. Please place it in the box and the staff will then come out and get it. We will not be letting families drop it off at the front desk.

Thank you very much for everything you are doing to keep our residents and facility staff safe and healthy. We continue to monitor the situation in our community; we will keep you informed about any new precautions that are necessary to keep your loved ones safe.
