A message from: The Village at Skyline Pines

Dear Residents, Families, Friends,

Supporting your loved one in a long-term care facility we recognize the hardship that our residents and families are experiencing right now due to COVID-19, and we hear your concerns about the restrictions that have been put into place to reduce the risk of spread of COVID-19. As part of our facility's commitment to protecting residents, families, and staff from serious illness and complications, we are continuing to follow guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), and the South Dakota Health Department, which includes restricting all visitation, except for certain compassionate care reasons, such as end-of-life. Due to the high risk of spread once COVID-19 enters a facility, we must continue these protections. We will continue to provide families with any new updates regarding our facility's COVID-19 status via phone and on our Village website.

We know that your presence is important for your loved one and soon we would like to start the outside visits. We do not have a date of when we will start this but when we do, we will let everyone know. In the meantime, the families that would like to continue to schedule virtual visitation (such FaceTime,) or calling the residents phone or writing a letter) so that you can continue to communicate with your loved one. All window visits must be scheduled with Kammy.
